## ABOUT THE DISTRICT

Current high school enrollment is 1,098 students. Courses include 26 career and technical programs and academic offerings of English, Foreign Language, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. In addition, Adult & Continuing Education serves approximately 1,373 individuals each year. The Medina County JVSD was created in 1970 with the goal of providing career and technical education opportunities to the youth and adults of Medina County. The District serves six associate districts. They include Black River Local, Brunswick City, Buckeye Local, Cloverleaf Local, Highland Local, and Medina City. The District is supported by two permanent levies.

The Medina County JVSD employs 86 teachers and administrators. More than 49% of staff members have a masters degree or higher. The average teacher has taught for 12 years in the District. The Career Center also employs 65 classified staff who clean and maintain the facilities and assist teachers and administrators in carrying out their responsibilities. The staff is dedicated to providing outstanding career and technical opportunities for Medina County residents.

## ABOUT THE COMMUNITY

The District is situated approximately two miles west of the Medina City Square. The property is 110 acres. The campus is comprised of a main building, agriculture/science building, a horse barn, maintenance building and fire tower. The City of Medina is approximately 25 miles south of Cleveland and 20 miles west of Akron. Overall, there is approximately 300,000 square feet of teaching space. Medina County hosts three major cities—Brunswick, Medina and Wadsworth. The area provides many recreational opportunities including recreation centers, the Medina County Park System, and numerous golf courses. Medina County offers a mix of urban and rural living with easy access to major cities and highways.
