

### Subject to licensure discipline RC 3319.31(B)

The State Board may limit, suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue a license, certificate or permit for any of the following:

- (1) Engaging in an immoral act, incompetence, negligence or conduct that is unbecoming to the applicant's or person's position;
- (2) A plea of guilty to, finding of guilty by a jury or court of, or a conviction of any of the following:
  - a. A felony not listed in RC 3319.31(C);
  - b. An offense of violence not listed in RC 3319.31(C);
  - c. A theft offense not listed 3319.31(C) (see list below);<sup>1</sup>
  - d. A drug abuse offense other than a minor misdemeanor and not listed in 3319.31(C) (see list below);<sup>2</sup>
  - e. A violation of a municipal ordinance substantively comparable to any of the above.

<sup>2</sup> Includes a violation of a current or former statute in another state or federal law that is substantially equivalent to a listed offense, an offense under an existing or former statute in Ohio or another state or federal law of which planting, cultivating, harvesting, processing, making manufacturing, producing, shipping, transporting, delivering, acquiring, possessing, storing, distributing, dispensing, selling inducting another to use, administering to another, using or otherwise dealing with a controlled substance is an element, and conspiracy, attempt or complicity to commit any applicable offense.

<sup>3</sup> "Offense of violence" is not defined in RC 3319.39. RC 2901.01 defines "offense of violence" and includes the listed offenses, which are not listed in RC 3319.31(C).
