MEIGS COUNTY FAIR PASSES


Any student that passes all parts of the OAA or has a 15 point increase in score from last year's test.



(After School for Kids)

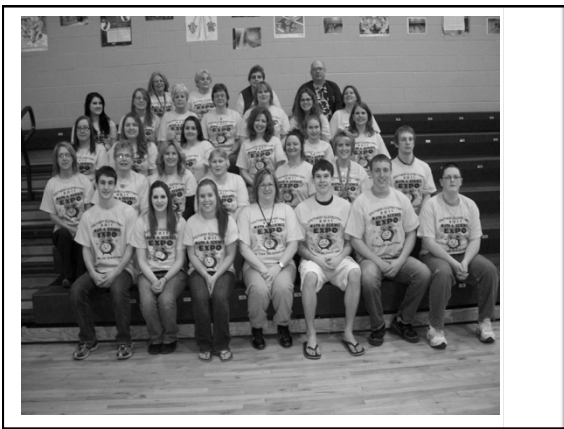
- 21st Century Grant- Federal
