About Our Schools

- Enrollment 3,806
- 5 1 high school, 1 middle school and 3 elementary schools
- Through 1985, our student ethnicity was never higher than 10% African American

About Our Schools

- Over the past 20 years, our student ethnicity slowly changed to the point where in 2012 ov 90% of our students are African American, variable of teaching staff is white. Race problems are NOT an issue.
- In 2012 we had an 19% transience rate
- In 2012 the percentage of our students on fre and reduced lunch was 63%

About Our Schools

- In 2002-03 school year the district endured a 9week strike (45 teaching days)
- State Report Card Designations through 2004 had Mapie Heights never ranked higher than "Academic Watch", with the majority of those years spent in "Academic Emergency"
- In 2004 Maple Heights was ranked in "Academic Emergency" - one of only four districts in the state to receive this designation



About Our Schools- Results

 In 2005 Maple Heights made the largest gain in the State of Ohio on report card designation, improving 2 designations

The district attained its first ever ranking of Continuous Improvement, and in 2011, we were ranked as an Effective school district, our highest ranking to date.

Timeline for the Last Two Decade

- 1990's School Board, Superintendent and Board Attorney corrupt the District.
- Pay scale falls to lowest in county, but highes legal fees in county.
- Oppressive "dictator style" Superintendent an School Board create huge riff between staff, community and administration. Examples: Victaping of all meetings, 100's of grievances, harassment of President, restrictions of access records, schools, etc.

STRIKE TIME WHAT TO THINK ABOUT

Trust between Teachers and Administration is at an almost zero level.

Events of the last decade

- August, 2003 MHTA works with Old (Strike) Board to pass two school levies.
- November, 2003 MHTA supports the campaign for 3 New School Board Members and defeats 3 incumbents.
- January, 2004 At the first New Board Meeting, lawyers are fired and Board publicly thanks teachers for support and caring about the schools.

Events of the Last Decade

- March, 2004-September, 2005

 Teach negotiations extend thru the 04-05 school yes with old superintendent, but new school boar
- Old Superintendent gets multiple additional duties and decides to retire.
- Teachers placed on committee to select new superintendent.
- New Superintendent, Dr. Keenan, is hired!

Events of the Last Decade

- During negotiations, new superintenden is appointed and encourages teachers to go to arbitration.
- Arbitrator makes rulings and two year contract is signed, taking 18 months to accomplish. This means negotiations wi start again in 6 months.
- Superintendent Keenan talks about building <u>trust</u> with teachers and opens lines of communication.

Creation of Labor/Management Committee

Meeting monthly to discuss issues that both sides may have.

Open discussion of issues, helps to build <u>trust</u> on both sides.

Agenda items are submitted several days in advance

Events of the Last Decade

- 2006 Teacher negotiations settled in 3 days, with a year contract. Both teams go to Sawmill Creek Resort for negotiations. Board picks up expenses and still saves money. **Trust** is developing.
- 2008 Bond issue is passed by the community to construct five new school buildings, which includes 1 High School, 1 Middle School and 3 Elementary School in a campus setting. (Project is \$110 million) More trust.
- 2009 -Teacher Contract again settled in 3 days with another 3 year contract. Teams again go to Sawm Creek Resort. Board picks up expenses. <u>Trust</u> again

Recent Events

- 2012 Teacher Contract and Support Staff Contract again settled in 3 days with another year contract as the teams go to Geneva St Park and settle.
- This now makes **NINE** years of Contracts, settled in **NINE** Days of negotiations. Each s is open with each other and **TRUST** is again a major factor!

Recent Events

- Creation of Post-Secondary Program
- In cooperation with Cleveland State University.
- Students are taught by CSU professors in our High School.
- -College credit and they do not have leave the building.

Parental Involvement

- Educating the parents (before, during the strike and after)
- General meeting, coffee club meeting
- Provide information and knowledge to parents, which increases parental involvement.
- Communication in any form, allows peor to understand what is going on.

Parental Involvement

- Creation of a Parent Academy
- Teaching parents to be better parents
- Increases concern for schooling of their child and the schools in general.


Parental Involvement

- Annual Family Funfest in May of each ye







Working Together to Pass Bond Issue
