The Superintendent Search

The Worthington City School District Board of Education seeks a dynamic, passionate educator/ Superintendent to replace retiring superintendent Melissa Conrath, who has led the district since January 2006.

The successful candidate will be a leader who embraces the challenge of taking an already excellent district to the next level to meet the demands of, and to work collaboratively with the Board, community, staff and students to maximize and realize the potential of every student.

About the Worthington City School District

The Worthington City School District consists of approximately 9,500 students and is consistently rated as "Excellent" on the State Report Card.

Worthington City Schools serve residents of Worthington and Riverlea, portions of Perry and Sharon townships and Columbus. It is roughly 20 square miles. The population is relatively stable, and residential development is nearing saturation. Approximately 37 percent of households have children in Worthington City Schools.

Students are housed in a district-wide preschool, 11 elementary schools, 4 middle schools, and 3 high schools. Currently, capacity exists at each of the schools with the exception of Liberty Elementary School.

Average test scores for the ACT and SAT are above state and national averages. Nearly 90 percent of Worthington graduates pursue higher education with at least 75 percent attending a four-year college or university.

Worthington City Schools has an operating budget of \$116.7 million and a total budget of \$153.9 million. The budget features 67 percent stable, local funding. The District last passed an operating levy in November 2009 and a bond issue in November 2006. For the 2009-2010 school year, the District had approximately 1,170 full-time equivalent employees.

The Worthington Area

The city of Worthington is roughly 15 minutes from downtown Columbus, the state capital. Founded in 1803, the city is home to approximately 13,300 residents.

Worthington remains a stable and affluent community with an exceptionally well-educated populace. Having retained its New England charm, it boasts an historic downtown shopping center, historical attractions, a top-ranked public school system, the Ohio Railway Museum, and several large recreational areas. Visitors to the area can stay at the landmark Worthington Inn, which was restored to its former elegance in the 1980s.

Family-friendly and community oriented, Worthington is home to a nationally recognized library system, an expanded community center, numerous churches and religious congregations and safe neighborhoods with tree-lined streets. Its arts community includes several theater, choral, and visual arts groups, and the Worthington Art Festival is ranked as one of the top 200 arts festivals in the country.

The position of Superintendent requires an Ohio superintendent's license and a master's degree, a doctorate is preferred but not required. The Board of Education is seeking a candidate with superior leadership skills with an emphasis on instructional leadership and communication skills. In addition, the candidate should demonstrate:

- Evidence of a comprehensive vision of the resources and ideas needed to move the district forward
- Proven record of academic improvement
- Proven experience in the position of superintendent or central office administrator
- Ability to manage and lead the instructional program
- Ability to understand and manage complex financial issues and provide solutions
- Understanding of building school/business partnerships
- Evidence of understanding key issues in education/research
- Demonstrated ability to build community support utilizing excellent communications skills with the Board, media and public
- Reputation for personal integrity
