The OSBA Capital Conference and Trade Show again drew over 9,000 attendees to the Greater Columbus Convention Center — 9,214 to be exact. The 61st annual event, which ran Nov. 13-16, held its place as the second-largest public education convention in the nation. And the Trade Show — with 554 exhibitor booths — is still the largest in the U.S. The 2017 Capital Conference is set for Nov. 12-15, and planning for the event has already begun.
