many K-12 teachers are unprepared to teach students the basics of online safety, security and ethics, and over a third of those surveyed receive no training in these issues. The survey, conducted by the National Cyber Security Alliance, a nonprofit group that works with the U.S.

Department of Homeland Security, found that 36% of the teachers said that they received no training in online security in the past year, while 40% reported receiving one to three hours of training.



# LEGISLATIVE REPORT

### Anti-bullying bill moving through legislative process

The General Assembly is slowly getting back to work following its holiday recess. The Senate Education Committee began the year by amending and passing House Bill (HB) 116, sponsored by Rep. John Barnes (D-Cleveland). The legislation makes several changes regarding public schools' anti-bullying policies. Under current law, school districts are required to have a policy prohibiting student harassment, intimidation or bullying on school property or at a school-sponsored activity.

Specifically, HB 116 makes the

following changes:

- Expands the definition of bullying to include cyberbullying.
- Requires school districts to expand their existing student antibullying policies to cover incidences of bullying that occur on school buses.
- Requires anti-bullying policies to include: a statement providing for possible suspension of students who engage in cyberbullying; a means for making anonymous reports of bullying; and disciplinary procedures for students who make false reports.
- Requires anti-bullying policies and an explanation of the seriousness of cyberbullying to be made available to students and parents.
- Requires that a written statement describing the board's antibullying policy and the consequences for violating the policy be sent to parents once a year. This can be sent electronically or with report cards.
- Requires age-appropriate instruction to all students on the board's bullying policy if state or

### Kids rally their resources for the red, white and blue

Instead of participating in their traditional holiday gift exchange, a group of Fort Frye Local (Washington) students pitched in to help the local American Legion. Beverly-Center Elementary School students pooled their money to buy the post 10 new American flags. The gift was a complete surprise, the legion's post commander said.

"We've had a project to put a flag on every light pole in town and had more than 60 flags up," Commander **Steve Wainwright** told a local newspaper. "But some of the kids noticed several flags were getting pretty weathered. ... It was a really nice gesture from the kids."

Fifth-grader **Lucas Pittman** said he and his classmates didn't mind forgoing presents to support their community.

"... We heard the legion wasn't getting enough money and the flags were getting pretty torn up," Pittman said. "So everybody in the

fourth, fifth and sixth grades donated \$2 each. We decided the flags were more important than just getting presents for Christmas."

Wainwright said the legion often presents educational programs at the local schools, especially around holidays such as Memorial Day and Veterans Day. The flags, which cost about \$22 each, will be put up to replace the worn ones in the spring.

federal funds are appropriated for this purpose.

• Requires school districts and educational service centers to provide training on their antibullying policies as a part of the in-service training required for all teachers, administrators, counselors, nurses and school psychologists.

It is important to note that while the bill expands the definition of bullying to cyberbullying, it does *not* expressly expand the definition to include bullying that occurs off school property. In addition, many of the proposed changes to antibullying policies included in HB 116 are already included in the sample policies provided by

OSBA.

OSBA has worked with both the House and Senate Education committees throughout the legislative process to achieve a bill that will protect students and be reasonable for school districts. HB 116 now goes to the full Senate for approval.
