OUR DISTRICT

The district is comprised of four buildings; Eastwood Elementary (PK-2), Prospect Elementary (3-5), Langston Middle School (6-8) and Oberlin High School with a total enrollment of approximately 986 students. The Oberlin School District is embarking on an OFCC building project which includes construction of a new school building to house grades PreK-5 on the site of the existing high school and the possible abatement and demolition of the two existing elementary school buildings.

The Oberlin City Schools receive strong community support with 16 of the last 17 ballot attempts passing. The electors of the school district approved an income tax in 2009 for current expenses which is now levied at the voter approved rate of 2.0% each year. The district has low annual expenditures (only 25% State funded) and only 3 of 14 Lorain County school districts show higher fund balance as a % of expenditures than Oberlin in 2023.

Oberlin is the first fully accredited PK-12 International Baccalaureate district in Ohio. The IB programs are well established and supported at all buildings along with the arts.

Oberlin has it all - the quaint life of a small town, the services of a large city, and the music and art of the world.
