(A) ~~For~~ Except as provided in division (C) of this 14  
section, for each of fiscal years 2020 and 2021, the Department 15  
of Education shall make the deductions and payments for each 16  
student enrolled in a community school, established under 17



Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code, in the manner prescribed by 18  
division (C) of section 3314.08 and division (D) of section 19  
3314.091 of the Revised Code, except that, for each of those 20  
fiscal years: 21

(1) The "formula amount" shall equal the amount specified 22  
in division (F) (1) of the section of ~~this act~~ H.B. 166 of the 23  
133rd General Assembly entitled "OPERATING FUNDING FOR FISCAL 24  
YEARS 2020 and 2021." 25

(2) "State education aid" for a school district from which 26  
a deduction is made shall mean the amount paid to the district 27  
for that fiscal year under the section of ~~this act~~ H.B. 166 of 28  
the 133rd General Assembly entitled "FUNDING FOR CITY, LOCAL, 29

formula for community schools for fiscal year 2021 go into 161

SYNOPSIS 165

**Temporary funding formula for certain dropout 166  
prevention and recovery e-schools 167**

**Section 265.230 of H.B. 166 of the 133rd General 168  
Assembly 169**

For fiscal year 2021, establishes a new funding formula 170  
for students enrolled in grades eight through twelve in 171  
internet- and computer-based community schools (e-schools) that 172  
were designated for the 2019-2020 school year as e-schools in 173  
which a majority of the students were enrolled in a dropout 174  
prevention and recovery program. 175

Specifies that such an e-school is to receive both of the 176  
following for each student enrolled in grades eight through 177  
twelve in the school: 178

(1) An opportunity grant equal to between \$1,750 and 179  
\$6,020 that is calculated based on the number of hours the 180  
student participates in learning opportunities and the number of 181  
courses completed by the student; 182

(2) Additional funding for special education and career- 183  
technical education, if applicable for the student, that is 184

calculated based on the student's special education category,	185
career-technical category, or both, and the number of hours the	186
student participates in learning opportunities.	187
(Currently, all e-schools are paid the full amount of the	188
opportunity grant, special education funding, and career-	189
technical education funding for each student enrolled in the	190
school on a full-time equivalency basis.)	191
Provides for these funds to be deducted from the state	192
education aid of a student's resident district and transferred	193
to the student's e-school in the same manner as funding for e-	194
schools is deducted and transferred under current law.	195
