Our District

Midview Local School District is a public school district located in central Lorain County. Covering more than 75 square miles, our district serves around 3,000 students in grades PK-12 from six different cities and municipalities: Grafton Village, Grafton Township, Eaton Township, Carlisle Township, and Elyria City.

Our Board of Education building and five schools – North Elementary, West Elementary, East Intermediate, Midview Middle School, and Midview High School – are located in Grafton, OH, on one campus.

At Midview, we are committed to providing our students with a comprehensive education that supports their academic and social-emotional needs while nurturing their personal interests. Our work is strengthened by an incredibly supportive community of educators, families, and partners who truly bring our mission to life: **where the community educates and empowers.**

Midview Local Schools is excited to announce a transformative \$27 million investment in its athletic facilities, made possible through a historic \$8.5 million in grant funding and private donations from The Ross Foundation and the Cromling family. What is a Middie?: According to members of Midview's first graduating class, the Board of Education couldn't settle on a mascot. They turned the task over to the student body, who also couldn't come to a consensus. The evening before our school's first-ever football game, a local reporter from The Chronicle-Telegram referred to us as the "Middies." The U.S. Navy's slang term for a midshipman stuck, and thus, we became the Midview Middies.
