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(8) For students in grades kindergarten through eight with family incomes at or below two hundred per cent of the federal poverty guidelines, as defined in section 5104.46 of the Revised Code, the school agrees not to charge any tuition in excess of the scholarship amount established pursuant to division (A)(11) (a) of section 3317.022 of the Revised Code, excluding any increase described in that division.

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(9) For students in grades kindergarten through eight with 52 family incomes above two hundred per cent of the federal poverty 53 guidelines, whose scholarship amounts are less than the actual 54 tuition charge of the school, the school agrees not to charge 55 any tuition in excess of the difference between the actual 56 tuition charge of the school and the scholarship amount 57 established pursuant to division (A)(11)(a) of section 3317.022 58 of the Revised Code, excluding any increase described in that 59 division. The school shall permit such tuition, at the 60 discretion of the parent, to be satisfied by the family's 61 provision of in-kind contributions or services. 62

(10) The school agrees not to charge any tuition to families of students in grades nine through twelve receiving a scholarship in excess of the actual tuition charge of the school less the scholarship amount established pursuant to division (A) (11) (a) of section 3317.022 of the Revised Code, excluding any increase described in that division.

(11) It annually administers the applicable assessments prescribed by section 3301.0710, 3301.0712, or 3313.619 of the 70 Revised Code to each scholarship student enrolled in the school 71 in accordance with section 3301.0711 or 3301.0712 of the Revised 72 Code and reports to the department of education the results of 73 each such assessment administered to each scholarship student,

(B) The state superintendent shall revoke the registrationof any school if, after a hearing, the superintendent determinesthat the school is in violation of any of the provisions ofdivision (A) of this section.

(C) Any public school located in a school district 94 adjacent to the pilot project district may receive scholarship 95 payments on behalf of parents pursuant to section 3317.022 of 96 the Revised Code if the superintendent of the district in which 97 such public school is located notifies the state superintendent 98 prior to the first day of March that the district intends to 99 admit students from the pilot project district for the ensuing 100 school year pursuant to section 3327.06 of the Revised Code. 101

(D) Any parent wishing to purchase tutorial assistance 102

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from any person or governmental entity pursuant to the pilot 103 project program under sections 3313.974 to 3313.979 of the 104 Revised Code shall apply to the state superintendent. The state 105 superintendent shall approve providers who appear to possess the 106 capability of furnishing the instructional services they are 107 offering to provide." 108
