BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That section 3313.6120 of the Revised Code be	9
enacted to read as follows:	10
Sec. 3313.6120. (A) As used in this section:	11
(1) "End-of-course examination" means an end-of-course	12
examination prescribed under section 3301.0712 of the Revised	13
Code.	14
(2) "District or school" means any of the following:	15
(a) A city local exempted village or joint vocational	16

(b) A community school established under Chapter 3314. of	18
the Revised Code;	19
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(c) A STEM school established under Chapter 3326. of the	20
Revised Code;	21
(d) A college-preparatory boarding school established	22
under Chapter 3328. of the Revised Code;	23
(e) The state school for the deaf;	24
(f) The state school for the blind;	25
(g) A chartered nonpublic school.	26
(3) "Qualifying course" means a course associated with an	27
<pre>end-of-course examination.</pre>	28
(B) (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in	29
sections 3313.618 and 3313.6114 of the Revised Code, for the	30
2020-2021, 2021-2022, 2022-2023, and 2023-2024 school years, a	31
student may use the student's final course grade in a course	32
associated with an end-of-course examination in lieu of the	33
score the student receives on the examination to satisfy	34
conditions for a high school diploma prescribed under sections	35
3313.618 and 3313.6114 of the Revised Code.	36
(2) For the purposes of determining whether a student	37
satisfies a condition, a final course grade shall be equivalent	38
to a level of skill prescribed under division (B)(5)(a) of	39
section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code or a competency score	40
prescribed under division (B) (10) of that section, as follows:	41
(a) Any "A" letter grade shall be equivalent to an	42
advanced level of skill.	43

(b) Any "B" letter grade shall be equivalent to an	44
accelerated level of skill.	45
(c) Any "C" letter grade shall be equivalent to a	46
proficient level of skill.	47
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(d) Any "D" letter grade shall be equivalent to a basic	48
<u>level of skill.</u>	49
(e) Any "F" letter grade shall be equivalent to a limited	50
<u>level of skill.</u>	51
(f) Any "C" letter grade or higher shall be equivalent to	52
a competency score.	53
(g) In the case of a course for which a pass or fail	54
designation is issued rather than a letter grade for a final	55
course grade, a fail designation shall be equivalent to an "F"	56
letter grade and a limited level of skill. For a pass_	57
designation, the student's district or school shall determine	58
which level of skill is equivalent to the student's performance	59
in the course. A pass designation also shall be equivalent to a	60
competency score.	61
Section 2. Notwithstanding anything in the Revised Code or	62
Administrative Code to the contrary, for the 2020-2021 school	63
year only:	64
(A) Any city, exempted village, local, or joint vocational	65
school district, any community school established under Chapter	66
3314. of the Revised Code, any STEM school established under	67
Chapter 3326. of the Revised Code, any chartered nonpublic	68
school, and the State School for the Deaf and the State School	69
for the Blind shall not be required to administer the end-of-	7 C
course examination in the area of American history prescribed	71
under division (B)(2) of section 3301.0712 of the Revised Code.	72

(B) The Department of Education shall not exclude any	73
student to whom the assessment was not administered in the 2020-	74
2021 school year under division (A) of this section from	75
counting in a district's or school's enrollment for the 2021-	76
2022 school year pursuant to division (L)(3) of section 3314.08,	77
division (E)(3) of section 3317.03, or division (C) of section	78
3326.37 of the Revised Code.	79
(C) If a student was not administered the assessment in	80
the 2020-2021 school year under division (A) of this section,	81
that school year shall not count in determining if the student	82
is subject to withdrawal from a school pursuant to section	83
3313.6410 or 3314.26 of the Revised Code.	84
(D) No student who received a scholarship under the	85
Educational Choice Scholarship Program under section 3310.03 or	86
3310.032 of the Revised Code, the Jon Peterson Special Needs	87
Scholarship Program under section 3310.52 of the Revised Code,	88
or the Pilot Project Scholarship Program under section 3313.975	89
of the Revised Code for the 2020-2021 school year shall be	90
considered ineligible to renew that scholarship for the 2021-	91
2022 school year solely because the student was not administered	92
the assessment in the 2020-2021 school year under division (A)	93
of this section.	94
Section 3. Notwithstanding anything in the Revised Code to	95
the contrary, all of the following apply:	96
(A) This section applies to any student who meets both of	97
the following criteria:	98
(1) The student was enrolled in the twelfth grade in the	99
2020-2021 school year or was on track to graduate in the 2020-	100
2021 school year, as determined by the school district or other	101

public or chartered nonpublic school in which the student was	102
enrolled, regardless of the graduation cohort in which the	103
student is included.	104
(2) The student had not completed the requirements for a	105
high school diploma under section 3313.61, 3313.612, or 3325.08	106
of the Revised Code or under Section 3 of H.B. 491 of the 132nd	107
General Assembly.	108

(B) A city, exempted village, local, or municipal school	109
district, a community school established under Chapter 3314. of	110
the Revised Code, a STEM school established under Chapter 3326.	111
of the Revised Code, a chartered nonpublic school, the State	112
School for the Blind, and the State School for the Deaf shall	113
grant a high school diploma to any student to whom this section	114
applies, if the student's principal, in consultation with	115
teachers and counselors, reviews the student's progress toward	116
meeting the requirements for a diploma and determines that the	117
student has successfully completed the curriculum in the	118
student's high school or the individualized education program	119
developed for the student by the student's high school pursuant	120
to section 3323.08 of the Revised Code, or qualified under	121
division (D) or (F) of section 3313.603 of the Revised Code. No	122
district or school shall grant a high school diploma under	123

(C) If the board of education of a school district or the	125

Section 4. (A) Notwithstanding anything in the Revised	140
Code or Administrative Code to the contrary, for the 2020-2021	141
school year only, the board of education of any city, exempted	142
village, local, joint vocational, or municipal school district,	143
the governing authority of any community school established	144
under Chapter 3314. of the Revised Code, the governing body of	145
any STEM school established under Chapter 3326. of the Revised	146
Code, and the governing authority of any chartered nonpublic	147
school that enrolls students receiving a state scholarship shall	148
administer the spring administration of any assessment	149
prescribed under sections 3301.0710, 3301.0711, 3301.0712,	150
3313.903, and 3314.017 of the Revised Code as follows:	151
(1) For online testing:	152
(a) English language arts assessments for all grades, from	153
March 22, 2021, through May 7, 2021;	154
(b) Mathematics, science, and social studies assessments	155
for all grades, from March 29, 2021, through May 21, 2021.	156
(2) For paper format testing:	157
(a) Third-grade English language arts assessment, from	158
March 22, 2021, through April 23, 2021;	159
(b) English language arts assessments for any of grades	160

(c) Mathematics, science, and social studies assessments	163
for all grades, from March 29, 2021, through May 14, 2021.	164
(B) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall	165
designate times for the administration of the assessments	166
prescribed under those sections and shall extend any other	167
deadlines related to the assessments accordingly.	168
(C) Notwithstanding division (G)(2)(b) of section	169
3301.0711 of the Revised Code, for the assessments administered	170
under this section, the department or an entity with which the	171
department contracts for the scoring of the third-grade English	172
language arts assessment shall send to each school district or	173
school a list of the individual scores of all persons taking	174
that assessment not later than June 28, 2021.	175
Section 5. Notwithstanding anything in the Revised Code or	176
the Administrative Code to the contrary, no school district	177
shall require the parent of any student who was instructed at	178
home in accordance with section 3321.04 of the Revised Code for	179
the 2020-2021 school year to submit to the district	180
superintendent the academic assessment report required under	181
rule 3301-34-04 of the Administrative Code as a condition of the	182
district allowing the student to continue to receive home	183
instruction for the 2021-2022 school year.	184
Section 6. For the 2020-2021 school year, the Department	185
of Education shall seek a waiver from the United States	186
Secretary of Education for the accountability and school	187
identification requirements of the "Elementary and Secondary	188
Education Act of 1965," 20 U.S.C. 6301 et seq.	189

Section 7. Notwithstanding the second paragraph of	190
division (A) of Section 6 of H.B. 409 of the 133rd General	191
Assembly, the Department of Education shall report any data that	192
it has regarding the performance of school districts and	193
buildings for the 2020-2021 school year by October 14, 2021.	194
Section 8. This act is hereby declared to be an emergency	195
measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public	196
peace, health, and safety. The reason for such necessity is to	197
ensure that the act's provisions for the 2020-2021 school year	198
go into effect during that school year. Therefore, this act	199
shall go into immediate effect.	200
